As an early childhood education supervisor, I have found that the teachers who experienced firsthand the work of "Dinosaur Dan", the regional Director of High Touch High Tech, have more confidence in adding and implementing science in their lesson planning.

There is less "dumbing down" to the children and, as a result, the children's science vocabulary is growing.
